Dear SJF Families,

I hope you enjoyed your week. One of the things that I value most about this newsletter is that it allows me the opportunity to reflect on all of the things that we have accomplished, all of the things that we have struggled with and learned from and all of the things that we can do better. It allows me to start the following week with a fresh slate, focusing on our priorities.

This upcoming week's priority is the ASPIRE test. The ASPIRE test impacts our students in grades  $3^{rd} - 8^{th}$  and will be taken April  $2^{nd} - 5^{th}$ . Though this standardized test is important in regard to measuring our students' academic growth and progress as well as giving our school a gauge as to where we may be experiencing pitfalls in our curriculum, it certainly isn't everything. I would like to encourage our students to be confident in their abilities, do their absolute best and to celebrate whatever their score may be, but to remember that it isn't the only way to measure one's intelligence. This test does not assess the fact that several of our students speak more than one language or can sing, dance and paint a picture. It doesn't measure their ability to play a musical instrument or their success in an athletic competition. The test doesn't understand that our students help their grandparents or an elderly neighbor, watch their siblings after school or that they are the glue that holds their friendships together and that the world is a brighter place simply because they are in it. So, please, as we approach the week of ASPIRE testing, please partner with me and remind your children that though this test is important, and we want them to do their absolute best, it isn't everything because there are many different ways to measure their intelligence and what makes them uniquely wonderful.

One of our SJF parents, Kerry McNicholas, created a beautiful flyer, which is attached, discussing how much we appreciate your efforts in brining your little ones to church. We recognize how challenging it can be to attend church with young children, but we are so grateful for your efforts to guide and inspire your children each week. Thank you so much for attending mass with your family!


## Welcome to Saint John Fisher TO THE PARENTS OF YOUNG CHILDREN

- Relax! God put the wiggle in children; do not feel you have to suppress it in God's house.
- There is usually a Children's liturgy during 10:00 a.m. mass on Sunday. The kids love it and the parents can enjoy a quick moment of quietness to reflect. Be sure to come check it out!
- Sit toward the front where it is easier for your youngster to see and hear.
- Quietly explain the religious statues, stain-glass art and parts of the mass. Children love visuals.
- Sing the songs, pray and say the responses. Children learn by watching you.
- A small room is located in the back of church- feel free to bring your children there if they are feeling especially energized and spirited.
- If you need to leave mass with your child, feel free to do so, but please come back.
- Be free of worry; your efforts to pray with and through your children is one of the most beautiful and commendable ways to live out your Catholic mission.
- The more familiar your children become, the more at ease and engaged they will be. Try and bring them to mass whenever and wherever you can.
- Strive to keep your own faith alive through your daily actions.



#### **Holy Name Society**

#### 2019 SJF HNS 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Food Drive

The SJF Holy Name Society will be conducting its 11th annual parish-wide Food Drive. We need your help in order to make this a success and build on this tradition. The food drive will begin on Saturday, March 30th. Here is a rough outline of the drive and the times we are asking you to lend help to this worthy cause.

<u>Saturday Mach 30<sup>th</sup></u> – Teams of adult volunteers with help from young volunteers (SJF students/scouts/etc.) would go door to door through the neighborhood dropping off a bag and letter describing the Food Drive process and requesting parishioners to leave a bag with food on the porch the following Saturday (April 6<sup>th</sup>). We think your time commitment that day would be between 9:00 and 11:00 AM. Please come to Kane Hall at 9:00 AM to pick up your bags and street assignments.

<u>Saturday April 6<sup>th</sup></u> – Teams again would go through the neighborhood and collect canned goods from front porches. These items would be collected and brought back to SJF. Separate teams would assemble and fill boxes back at SJF. These would be loaded into a truck and then delivered to food pantries. We again anticipate the time commitment would be 9:00-11:00 AM. Again, come to Kane Hall at 9:00 AM for street assignments.

As you can see, this drive will require quite a bit of volunteerism. We will always need help packing boxes at SJF. Please respond back to <u>sjfhns@gmail.com</u> with any questions.
